

From Amy's Desk



Thankyou to everyone for welcoming me to Kellock Lodge for the second time in my career.

Here is a little bit about me, I grew up in Yarck and did all my schooling here in Alex. I have fond memories of visiting Kellock with the primary school choir for Christmas carols and walking up after school to hang out with the residents while I waited for Mum to finish work.

After I finished school, I went straight to University at Albury/Wodonga and studied my Bachelor of Nursing. While I studied, I worked here at Kellock as a Personal Carer on weekends and Uni holidays. I then ventured down to Melbourne working and studying at The Alfred Intensive Care Unit. After a couple of years I moved over to The Royal Childrens and studied there also. I then did a few years in the Emergency Department at The Royal Melbourne Hospital which was such an incredible experience and a career

My husband and I moved to Dubai at the start of 2019 where we spent almost 4 years, working and travelling. Sorry to say, specially to Victorians, but we got a lot of international travelling done while most of Australia was in and out of lockdowns. It was eventually time to come home so we bought a 23 acre property in Romsey, near Kilmore. We signed our settlement documents from our home in Dubai without having set foot on the property which was pretty daunting.

We have lived in Romsey since October and we now have 10 head of cattle. A bit of a mix with a highland steer (Hector), 1 angus steer (Angus), 4 little Dexter cows (Lima, Bolivia, Berlin and Sahara) and their 4 calves born this year (Lilly, Bill, Sully and Bindi). We also have 4 chooks (Butter, Lemon, Honey and Kentucky....I didn't name them, they were a wedding present) and our little border terrier (Nugget) who is on permanentloan from my parents

Outside of work I like to get involved in the farming jobs at my parents farm and my own place, learning about gardening, I like to read books and I watch Landline and Gardening Australia every week. I play netball for the Romsey Redbacks, which is why during netball season I'm not at Kellock on Fridays but working from home alternately so I can get to training. I also really enjoy photography, I had a photography business for a while and did a few weddings for my local mates as well as volunteering for the organisation Heartfelt. I intend to circulate a few of my own photos on the wall in my office.

For the 6months prior to becoming the Director of Nursing I was a roustabout (wool handler in the shearing sheds in the Murrindindi area). Rousing was a lot of fun and a very physically demanding job requiring plenty of concentration to keep the board clear for the shearers. I also went to shearing school only a few weeks before starting at Kellock. I am proud to say I can successfully shear a sheep. It was a really good break from Nursing, something I really needed after working in Dubai for 4 years.

When I was presented with the opportunity of interviewing for the role of Director of Nursing at Kellock I was interested straight away. It really felt like time to come back to my roots, come back to the community that supported me when I was growing up and come back to the place where my career literally started. I do feel very proud to be able to come to work everyday with the focus to try to make a difference to our staff, residents and their families.

I deliberately mention our staff first because without them Kellock does not exist to be able to serve our beautiful community. I believe my career has come a full circle now, and I feel comforted in being back at Kellock Lodge.

To finish I'd like to share two phrases I try to live by. "What you permit, you promote". Meaning if you walk by a problem or witness something not right and don't say anything or do something about it you inevitably promote that kind of behaviour.

The other one is "look for the good". Everyone has what you might consider weird or complicated lives. Everyone has their own baggage, bad days and problems. But everyone also has good in them. It's up to us to look for the good.
