Hello Everyone,

The spring flowers are looking absolutely stunning around the courtyards and gardens at the moment. There is tall purple Iris right outside the reception windows, it catches my eye every day.

This month we have been lucky enough to receive a beautiful donation from *Dindi Naturals* at Yarck of some essential oil blends and a massage oil to use for our palliative care residents. I am seeking a donation for a couple more diffusers from the company that Dindi uses too so hopefully we can secure those soon. We are expanding and improving our delivery of end of life care and anything that can provide comfort at this time is really important to us. Dindi provided four different oil blends and a card that explains the scents and what these are good for (as you can see in the picture). A favourite so far is "lullaby" essential oil blend, its subtle but very very nice and calming. So, thank you to Dindi for the donation and supporting our efforts in caring for the residents and families here.

We had a visit from Dementia Support Australia this month and they have provided us a Baby doll named "Ben" as well as a bassinet. Holding and rocking a baby can be an extremely relaxing and nostalgic experience for residents living with dementia and I thank Dementia Support Australia for their input and ongoing support. 'Baby therapy' is a resource used with caution and careful approaches, I hope to get some more education sessions going for our staff so we can utilise it more.

Our community is at the core of what we do and its great to have the involvement from local companies.

The care ember of the Goulburn Valley Palliative care team staff at Kellock have received some Oral Health education this month, keeping the teeth and gums clean and healthy is really important so thanks to Dawn Berry for assisting me with that. We also did some palliative care discussion sessions to go over our policies, procedures, what we have in place and what staff feel we need to improve. We have booked Sam Moorhouse to run two formal sessions in November also-looking forward to that.

We said good-bye to two lovely residents this month. We watched Hazel's funeral online (held at Healesville) and a couple of us attended Marlene's in Alexandra. Being able to see all the beautiful photos of lives well lived, their families that we have heard about in stories and hear more about their lives when they were younger is a real privilege and reminds us why we do what we do every day.

About the Aged Care Standards

As promised we will continue our journey through Standards.

Standard 3:

Kellock Lodge's Statement:

Kellock Lodge delivers safe and effective personal care, clinical care, or both personal care and clinical care, in accordance with our resident's needs, goals and preferences to optimise health and well-being..

The Standard applies to all services delivering personal and clinical care specified in the Quality of Care Principles 2014. Personal and clinical care and services can include:

- supervising or helping with bathing, showering, personal hygiene and dressing
- providing personal mobility aids and communication assistance for residents with impaired hearing, sight or speech
- nursing services, such as catheter care and wound management
- services aimed at getting back or improving a consumer's independence or daily living activities specialised therapy services, such as support for residents living with cognitive impairment.

Resident Outcome:

I get personal care, clinical care, or both personal care and clinical care, that is safe and right for me.




